

## Huskins Bill Courses

**Catawba Valley Community College** offers Huskins courses to high school students. Huskins courses are college-credit courses that are available throughout the high school day. Huskins courses provide both high school credits toward graduation and college credit hours, and many transfer to the N.C. University System and many private colleges and universities. Courses are held at varying sites, including some high school campuses, CVCC's main campus, and CVCC's Newton Center. Some Huskins courses are delivered online (Learn and Earn Online). College tuition is **free** to all high school students enrolled in a Huskins course. If a student takes a Huskins course offered on one of CVCC's campuses, a minimal student activity fee is charged and is the student's responsibility.

To participate in the Huskins program, students must meet CVCC's entrance requirements and course prerequisite requirements and be approved by the high school principal. All students registering for Huskins courses are required to complete a CVCC application. Students must also complete CVCC's placement test, COMPASS, if it is listed as a college prerequisite in the course information. COMPASS—Computer-Adaptive Placement Assessment and Support System—is offered on the campus of CVCC and at each high school once a year.
