Questions about School Choice

Can parents choose any school in the district when transferring their children from a Title I School Improvement school?

No. School districts determine which schools comprise the schools of choice.

Which schools can be designated as schools of choice?

Public schools of choice must not be in Title I School Improvement or considered to be persistently dangerous.

Must parents accept a choice option?

Parents always have the option of declining a school choice and continuing at the original school.

Who pays for public school choice transportation?

School districts pay.

How does a parent request a school choice transfer?

Specific policies and procedures are set by individual school districts. Catawba County Schools sends a form for parents to use by a designated date if they choose to send their child to a different school.

How long must students be allowed to attend the school of their choice?

If a student transfers to a choice school, the school district must permit the student to remain in that school until he or she has completed the highest grade in the school, if the family remains in the district. However, the school district is not obligated to provide transportation for the student after the end of the school year in which the original school is no longer identified for Title I School Improvement.

When is a school no longer considered a Title I School Improvement school?

To exit Improvement, schools must make AYP for two years in a row in the subject (reading/language arts or math) that designated them for Improvement. If a Title I school makes AYP in any one year after entering Title I School Improvement, it does not move to the next level of sanctions. But, if it then fails to make AYP the year after that, it moves to the next level of the sanctions.

Dear Oxford Elementary School Parent or Guardian:

As a parent at Oxford Elementary School, you have options for your child in the 2011-2012 school year that require careful consideration. Please read this notice, taking special note of deadline dates and contact names and phone numbers you can access for additional information.

Oxford Elementary School receives federal Title I funds designed to help students who are not achieving at grade level in high-poverty schools. As a Title I school, Oxford Elementary School must make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in math or face sanctions directed by Title I.

According to North Carolina End-of-Grade student test results in 2010, Oxford Elementary School did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in math. Because 100% of students have not made AYP, the school has been in Title I school improvement for two years. This means the school has to offer School Choice to all parents.

Even if Oxford Elementary School makes AYP for all students this school year, it must continue to offer public school choice to all parents of students enrolled at the school next school year. In order to exit school improvement, the school must make AYP in the subject two years in a row.

Also, the school must offer free tutoring services to students receiving free or reduced-price lunch at Oxford Elementary School. (Eligible families may transfer to another school or receive free tutoring services, but not both.)

Your child's options for the 2012 school year are to:

1. **Remain at Oxford Elementary School next year; or**
2. **Enroll in another school, designated by the district, with transportation provided; or**
3. **Remain at Oxford Elementary School and, if eligible, receive free after school tutoring services.**

More information on each of these options is below.

1. **Remain at Oxford Elementary School for next school year (2011-2012)**

Staff members at Oxford Elementary School have a relationship with your child and want to continue serving your child through sixth grade. If you want your child to remain at Oxford Elementary School, you do not need to take additional action.

2. **Enroll in another designated school-(The school choices have changed!)**

You may request a transfer for your child to attend one of the following designated schools:

If you want to request to move to either of these schools for next school year, complete and return a "Request for a School Transfer" form (enclosed) for each child by June 6, 2011.

The district will respond to your request by phone and with written notice by June 20, 2011, regarding your child's school assignment and transportation availability. You then will have an opportunity to communicate whether you accept the approved choice or want your child to remain at Oxford Elementary School. If a requested transfer is approved, your child will be allowed to attend the choice school through the sixth grade.

(Educational records are confidential and access is limited to school officials having a genuine need to know.)

3. **Remain at Oxford Elementary School and receive free tutoring services**

The free tutoring program is available for students who receive free or reduced-price lunch and choose not to transfer. They will be offered after school tutoring programs by several providers. Qualified parents will receive letters offering registration for tutoring in September 2011. The tutoring will begin in October, 2011 and will be held again in January, 2012.
