Course Description: This course is the entry-level course for the Air Force Junior ROTC program. Academically this course is designed to put heavy emphasis on character education, team building skills, and career development. The *US Air Force Core Values* will be introduced and discussed as well as the Catawba County “*Seven Pillars of Character*.” One third of the course will be devoted to Leadership Training. Leadership training will include Air Force customs and courtesies, cadet corps activities, communication skills, drill and ceremonies, and leadership and management studies. Uniforms will be provided at no cost to the cadets and will be worn one day each week. Physical conditioning is an emphasis. Cadets should be capable of moderate physical activity. PT, & drill and ceremonies account for 20% of program. Service programs such as Adopt-a-Highway are also introduced.

Course objectives are:

1. Know the Pillars of Character as adopted by the Catawba County Board of Education.
2. Know the US Air Force Core Values and what they mean.
3. Know how the NC-954 Cadet Corps operates.
4. Learn how to wear and maintain the USAF uniform properly.
5. Learn how to perform basic drill and ceremonies.
