AEROSPACE SCIENCE LEADERSHIP COURSE

Credit Hours: 1 Elective Credit Hour

Course Description: This course is offered to students who are highly motivated, show excellent leadership potential, and enjoy being challenged. Enrollment in the AFJROTC V class provides the student with the opportunity to control, direct, and refine leadership skills in cadet management, drill and ceremonies, Air Force customs and courtesies, as well as wear of the uniform. This course will prepare students for leadership positions in school, the military, or later in life. When not working directly with the younger cadets, these leaders work on JROTC online courses in the JROTC computer lab. Good character, maturity, and a professional attitude are essential for students enrolled in this course. Uniforms will be provided at no cost to the cadets and will be worn one day each week. Physical conditioning is an emphasis. Cadets should be capable of moderate physical activity.

Course objectives are:

1. Be willing to learn to lead less experienced cadets in daily cadet activities.
2. Know the US Air Force Core Values and what they mean.
3. Know how the NC-954 Cadet Corps operates.
4. Learn how to wear, maintain, and inspect the USAF uniform properly.
5. Learn how to perform and teach drill and ceremonies.

Grading Procedures:

1. Leadership 40%
2. Uniform Inspections 30% Lab (Every Wednesday)
3. Research Paper 20%
4. Current Event Briefings 10% Homework (3 times during semester)
5. Note: If final exam is required, will count 25% of Grade.

Grading Scale:

Assignments:

1. All cadets are expected to come prepared for class each day. Bring pencils/pens and paper each day.
2. All cadets are required to wear the USAF uniform each Uniform Day (usually on Wednesdays).
3. All cadets are required to prepare their Current Event Briefing prior to coming to class.
4. All cadets are expected to participate fully in all cadet activities including drill practice and physical conditioning unless excused for medical reasons (doctor's/parent's notes are required to be excused).
5. Teach drill, do uniform inspections and assist in testing.
