ADVANCED DRILL – Unarmed/ Armed Regulation and Innovative Drill

Course Description: This course is offered to students who are highly motivated, show potential for competitive drill movements, drill sequencing leadership, and enjoy being challenged. Their placement in this class allows them to fine tune their basic drill skills and more importantly develop advanced innovative drill skills. These students will help others develop their skills while simultaneously developing their own skills in drill and ceremonies, Air Force customs and courtesies, and wear of the uniform. This course will prepare the student for numerous drill competitions, summer leadership school drill and leadership positions in school, in the military, or later in life. Good character, maturity, and a professional attitude are essential for students enrolled in this course. Physical conditioning is important. Cadets should be capable of moderate physical activity.

Course objectives are:

1. Learn regulation armed and innovative drill movements and sequences.
2. Know and understand the U.S. Air Force Core Values.
3. Know how to wear the USAF uniform properly.
4. Know how to perform regulation unarmed movements in drill and ceremonies.

Grading Procedures:

1. Quizzes 30% Quiz (Every Thursday)
2. Uniform Inspections 30% Lab (Every Wednesday)
3. Bearing and Behavior 30% Performance (Evaluated Daily)
4. Current Event Briefings 10% Homework (3 times during semester)
5. Note: If final exam is required, will count 25% of Grade.

Grading Scale:

Assignments:

1. All cadets are expected to come prepared for class each day. Bring pencils/pens and paper each day.
2. All cadets are required to wear the USAF uniform each Uniform Day (usually on Wednesdays).
3. All cadets are required to prepare their Current Event Briefing prior to coming to class.
4. All cadets are expected to participate fully in all cadet activities including drill practice and physical conditioning unless excused for medical reasons (doctor's/parent's notes are required to be excused).
