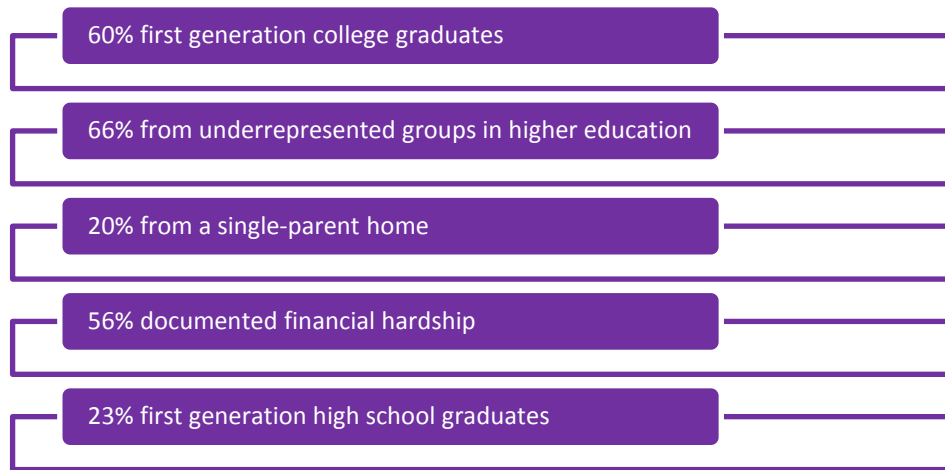


Challenger Early College High School

At A Glance

Challenger Early College High School opened in the fall of 2005 as a public high school, joint oversight project of the Catawba Valley Education Consortium with leadership and support from the North Carolina New Schools Project and resources from the North Carolina General Assembly.

Who does Challenger Early College serve?



Early college high schools blend the four years of traditional high school and the first two years of college in a rigorous yet supportive format, compressing the time it takes to complete what typically takes six years. This four to five year accelerated opportunity saves both time and money, producing skilled and credentialed graduates in our community.

Eighty-two percent of the graduating students of 2011 earned either their Associate Degree or two years of transferable college credit. All graduates complete a graduation project to show proficiency in an area of their choice.

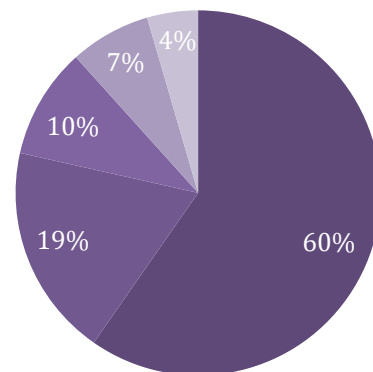
Students in each grade level work to master the following 21st Century Skills:

- Communication and collaboration
- Initiative and self-direction
- Productivity and accountability
- Leadership and responsibility

Students at Challenger Early College complete a minimum of fifty hours of community service reinforcing a spirit of stewardship and citizenship.
