

# SPANISH CLASSROOM RULES AND EXPECTATIONS

## Classroom Rules:

1. Arrive to class with **all** needed materials (notes, agenda, paper, and pencil).
2. Be in your seat **before** it is time to start.
3. When the teacher is giving instructions, **do not talk**.
4. **Do not distract** the teacher or other students.
5. Ask to be excused **only** if it is an emergency.

## Expectations:

1. If you are **late to class**, you must have a note from the teacher who detained you (NOT FROM THE OFFICE). If you arrive late without a note, your tardy will be unexcused. **Three unexcused tardies** will result in an automatic office referral!
2. Turn in **homework** at the beginning of class when a call is made for it. Points will be deducted on homework or assignments turned in late.
3. **Do not cause distractions** which cause loss of instructional time. Loss of instructional time **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED!!!**
4. Maintain an organized **notebook** containing all notes, returned work, and blank paper. (Notebooks are subject to unannounced inspections for a grade.)
5. **Stay on task**. You should not be working on assignments from other classes, reading a book, etc. unless you have finished your Spanish assignments early.
6. Sit in your **assigned seat**.
7. Treat other students and the teacher with **respect**. Talking back to the teacher and "rolling eyes" are not acceptable.
