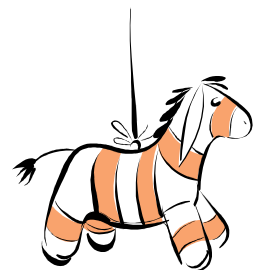

Present tense of -ar verbs

To create the forms of most **-ar** verbs, first drop the **-ar** from the infinitive, saving the **stem**:

hablar → **habl-**

Then add the **verb endings** to the stem: **-o, -as, -a, -amos, or -an**

Subject Pronouns	-ar endings
yo <i>I</i>	-o
tú <i>you (informal)</i>	-as
él <i>he</i> ella <i>she</i> Ud. <i>you (formal)</i>	-a
nosotros <i>we (masculine/mixed)</i> nosotras <i>we (feminine)</i>	-amos
ellos <i>they (masculine/mixed)</i> ellas <i>they (feminine)</i> Uds. <i>you (plural)</i>	-an

Here are the conjugated **forms** of **hablar**:

yo habl<u>o</u> <i>I speak, am speaking</i>
tú habl<u>as</u> <i>you (informal) speak, are speaking</i>
él habl<u>a</u> <i>he speak, is speaking</i>
ella habl<u>a</u> <i>she speak, is speaking</i>
Ud. habl<u>a</u> <i>you (formal) speak, are speaking</i>
nosotros habl<u>amos</u> <i>we (masc./mixed) speak, are speaking</i>
nosotras habl<u>amos</u> <i>we (fem.) speak, are speaking</i>
ellos habl<u>an</u> <i>they (masc./mixed) speak, are speaking</i>
ellas habl<u>an</u> <i>they (they) speak, are speaking</i>
Uds. habl<u>an</u> <i>you (plural) speak, are speaking</i>
